

Rx Review Pharmacist Qualifications

In order to participate in the Rx Review program, a pharmacist must meet the following criteria:

1. Have and maintain an unrestricted license in good standing to practice pharmacy in Colorado; and
2. Maintain professional liability insurance; and
3. Meet at least one of the following qualifications:
 1. Proof of completion of a pharmacy practice residency accredited by the American Society of Health Systems Pharmacists (ASHP) or the American Pharmaceutical Association (APhA); or
 2. A bachelor of pharmacy degree and completion of a certificate program accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) in each area of practice, and 40 hours of on site supervised clinical practice and training in each area in which the pharmacist is choosing to practice; or
 3. A Doctor of Pharmacy degree and completion of at least 40 hours of ACPE approved continuing education regarding clinical practice and 40 hours of on site supervised clinical practice and training in each area in which the pharmacist is choosing to practice; or
 4. Current Board specialty certification from the Board of Pharmaceutical Specialties, current certification from the National Institute for Standards in Pharmacist Credentialing (NISPC), or current certification from the Commission for Certification in Geriatric Pharmacy (CCGP). Such credentials must be in the area of pharmacy practice undertaken in the drug therapy management.
