Overview of the 2018 Legislative Session

- At least 20-30 bills that impacted pharmacy practice ranging from opioid legislation to Epidiolex® availability in pharmacies
- HB 18-1313
 - Clarified that pharmacists have prescriptive authority under the Colorado Medical Assistance Act and Statewide Protocols
- HB 18-1112
 - Mandates reimbursement of pharmacist provided services otherwise reimbursed/provided by an MD/DO or NP
 - Specific to third-party insurance in HPSAs



SBOP Rules 6 and 17

Convened as a result of SB 16-135 and HB 18-1313

- Addresses modernization of CDTM rules
- Statewide Protocol language
 - -Prescriptive authority
 - -Training requirements



Opioid Taskforce

- Bipartisan legislative committee
- Represented issues relative to pharmacy practice
 - -Technician regulation
 - -ePrescribing
 - -Medication Assisted Therapy administration reimbursement

Definitions

- Academies: Group of pharmacists and/or technicians representing special interest practices or local practice settings. Each academy elects one member of the academy to serve on the board of directors.
- Committees: opportunities for members to get involved and advance the practice the pharmacy in the state of Colorado.



Academy of Health-System Pharmacists

 This academy is the state affiliate of the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP), so has the benefit of ASHP national support in addition to CPS local support.

 AHP was formed to ensure that the current and future interests of healthsystem pharmacists are being promoted, represented, and recognized at the state level as well as within the parent organization, the Colorado Pharmacists Society (CPS).



Academy of New Practitioners

- The Academy of New Practitioners was started in 2012 to aid new practitioners as they forge their way into the diverse field of pharmacy in Colorado. Membership in the Academy is open to any Society member who considers him/herself a new practitioner, generally having graduated from a Doctor of Pharmacy degree program within the past seven years.

 - 1-2 Member at Large Pharmacist positions three-year terms expiring in June 2022
 - 1 Pharmacy Technician Representative one-year term expiring in June 2020
